## A letter from the Rector

*Dear friends,*

A couple of weeks ago I spent some time watching live debates in Westminster, as those elected to represent us in Parliament “debated” proposals for a deal for the UK’s exit of the European Union. I was struck that there was a great deal of talking – shouting in fact – and much less listening. There is no doubt our politics is in challenging times.



For the church, embroilment in controversial issues is nothing new. Often we struggle to handle them well. But we do have resources to help us reflect and learn to do better. The book of James contains some good advice for us in these difficult days in the words, “Understand this, my beloved: let everyone

be quick to listen, slow to speak, slow to anger.” Seeking unity is a recurring theme in the scriptures. In all our diversity, we are still one body.

In South Africa, there is a well-known phrase, “ubuntu”. Roughly translated it means “I am because we are.” It picks up on the idea of common bonds that hold us together as community, whatever our differences. We are created to live in relationship, and without each other, we are diminished.



In controversial situations we have to decide how to respond. The easy answer might be to turn away from those with whom we disagree. But this is a slippery slope, disregarding the humanity they share with us. It leads to alienation and the breakdown of relationships.

So what are we to do, when we feel strongly and our tongue would easily serve as a sword? Perhaps in such times, what comes to the fore is the wisdom of silence and the need to listen – to pay loving, careful attention - to the other. In silence we can listen; and careful listening might allow us to identify something we can relate to in the other: love, pain, hope. Silence may very often be the place where solidarity can begin. In the silence we might just hear the still, small voice of God reminding us that we all bear his image. And this is the starting point for finding common ground.

## Methodist Matters!

January saw us bid a final farewell to the Dunbar Methodist Church building as the sale to new owners neared completion. We have been able to bring some heritage boards and the Communion Table from the building to St Anne's. With the closure of the building, Harbour Lights youth club (formerly a Methodist Ministry but now looked after by Dunbar Area Christian Youth Project) needed a new home. The transition was helped over Christmas by the children taking part in our very popular crib service, and having a Friday afternoon

Puppet Show to which about 40 people from Harbour Lights and beyond came in December.



This is an exciting move for the children, who are enjoying exploring the church building and meeting in a new space. They even have a new, bigger pool table, delivered in style by the intrepid Mike Shaw (see photo!) This is also an opportunity for us to grow our links with these young people and their families. Many of them live very nearby and have challenging lives. Please do make them feel welcome if you encounter them.
