- 11.00 Hall closed: Judging commences
- 14.00 Show opens to exhibitors and visitors
- 15.45 Removal of exhibits not for sale
- 16.00 Prize-giving, followed by sale of exhibition produce & raffle draw

Proceeds of the produce sale go to Lavant Friendly Club

**All entry forms must be submitted not later than
Wednesday 1st August 2018, by 21.00 hrs**

Rules:

- 1 All exhibits to be in place by 10.45 am on the day of the show.
The hall will be open from 8.45 am.
No exhibitor may show more than one exhibit in any class.
Only one entry per household or allotment in adult classes 1-56 & 201-211
- 2 Exhibitors must be residents of the Parish of Lavant or of Summersdale or be members of Lavant Horticultural Society or be Lavant Allotment Holders.
- 3 Junior classes are also open to any child/grandchild of anyone who qualifies to exhibit in the Show (see 2 above) and to any pupil of Lavant Primary School.
- 4 All exhibits must have been grown in the garden or allotment of, or be made by the exhibitor.
Pot plants must have been in the exhibitor's possession for at least 3 months
The entry form must be signed to certify compliance with these rules.
The committee reserves the right to inspect the garden or allotment to satisfy themselves as to the bona fide character of any exhibit.
- 5 Exhibits in the Flower Arrangement classes (53 - 56 and 221) are exempt from the conditions of rule 4. No artificial flowers/plants or accessories are allowed in any class except where specifically stated.
- 6 Any exhibits that are not for sale must be marked 'R' on the Entry form.
The exhibitors must remove these from the show tables at 15.45.
Exhibits not reserved under this rule will be sold after the prize-giving.
- 7 The judges shall have complete discretion to give or to withhold any prize.
The award shall depend entirely on the quality of the exhibit.
Judges may award in any class any of 1st, 2nd or 3rd prizes or none at all.
- 8 The committee will take all reasonable care but will not be responsible for the loss of or damage to any exhibit.
- 9 Cups and awards must be returned to Roger Hart at Greens Barn, 67 Midhurst Road, Lavant, **not later than one week before the show.**
- 10 No cup or award may be taken away before the winner has signed an official receipt and the item has been engraved where appropriate.

Except for Classes 19 & 20, all exhibits **must** consist of **one variety/cultivar**

Exhibits must be placed directly on the show table or paper plate provided, **with no other display material** (except sand Class 12 & raffia Classes 4, 8 & 12).

- 55 An exhibit 'Votes for Women!', max 45 cm wide x 45 cm deep
- accessories may be used
- 56 A miniature exhibit, max 10 cm x 10 cm x 10 cm
- 221 Novice class:** 'The Season's Magic', max 35 cm wide x 35 cm deep
