

1. Natural Magic



A classic work on natural magic, Porta's text was revised throughout his lifetime, eventually growing into twenty short books. These contained writings on medicine, alchemy, occult philosophy, astrology, poisons, perfumes, optics, metallurgy, magnetism, zoology, gunpowder, geology and invisible ink. A wide-ranging work to say the least, the last chapter 'Chaos' discusses topics such as dragons to viper bites. It was first translated into English in 1658.


Featuring a range of magical and early scientific experiments, the book is decorated with woodcuts of alchemical distillation, mathematics and the use of lenses to ignite a fire. It also offers recipes for experiments in consciousness, '*potions that make a person out of his mind for a day, and provide* both visions wonderful and horrible'. (Sledge, J, 2020.)

Porta founded the Academia Secretorum Naturae, but Pope Gregory XIII ordered its end in 1578 under suspicion of occult practice. This contributed to some of his books being placed on the Index Librorum Prohibitorum, deemed heretical and banned by the Vatican.




King of The Witches: The World of Alex Sanders by June Johns, 1969


June Johns' biography of Alex Sanders, the founder of the Alexandrian Wiccan tradition with Maxine Sanders. Covers many aspects of the craft, with appendices on *The Book of Shadows*, *The Witches Calendar* and *Initiation Ceremonies*.

Early Print of The Cottingley Fairies Photograph, c1920

The first and most iconic of the Cottingley Fairy Photographs created by Frances Griffiths and Elsie Wright, which continues to fascinate more than a century later. This fantastical set of images captured the imagination of the public, Theosophists and likes of Arthur Conon Doyle.


Vegetarianism & Occultism by C. W. Leadbeater, 1930

Leadbeater defines occultism as 'the study of the hidden laws of nature,' which reveals its role 'intertwined with vegetarianism in the pursuit of spiritual truth and wholeness.' He outlines the many ways it benefits the body and spirit through nutrition, purity, and harmony with nature.

The book is dictated from a lecture delivered in Chicago March 22nd 1903.






The Great God Pan and The Inmost Light by Arthur Machen, 1895

Machen's classic of mystical horror, partly inspired by his times visiting the river Usk and Welsh towns of Caerleon and Caerwent. He describes the novel as an attempt to 'pass on the vague, indefinable sense of awe and mystery and terror that I had received' from seeing 'strange relics' unearthed at Caerwent, the ruined temple of 'Nodens, god of the depths.' (Machen, A, 1922).



Dion Fortune's fourth novel, often regarded as her most important work of fiction.



The Training & Work of an Initiate by Dion Fortune, 1930


Exploring the nature of initiation in the Western esoteric tradition, Fortune details the work and training of the *higher mysteries* structured in three parts, *Ethical, Theoretical* and *Practical.* Though a significant text in itself, it is also considered a companion volume to her earlier book *The Esoteric Orders and Their Work.*

The Angelic Hosts by Geoffrey Hodson, 1928



A clairvoyant study of the Angelic kingdom, Hodson's third book on the subject after 'The Brotherhood of Angels and of Men' and 'Be Ye Perfect'. He ventures to 'provide a basis from which a more detailed study of the angelic hierarchy may be made', also including chapters on Spirits of the Earth, Fire, Water and Air.

'I seemed to be standing with him submerged in a sea of fire, which was solid and allpervasive, yet translucent and transparent. I seemed also to see the sun-flower formation of the fire-aspect of the Logos and His system as if the angel and I were standing on one of the petals... I was standing completely submerged in a veritable cataract of flame as it rushed and swirled about me.'


Angel In the Forest: A Fairy Tale of Two Utopias by Marguerite Young, 1941

Marguerite Young's poetic history of two 19th Century Utopian communities at New Harmony, USA. The first settlement was led by German mystic Father George Rapp, who was influenced by the likes of Jacob Böehme, Philipp Jakob Spener, and Emanuel Swedenborg. He created his Rappite commune of around 800 residents, based upon a 'scriptural communism'.

Later they sold the land to Robert Owen, a Welshman described as the 'father of British socialism' who started an experimental socialistic community accompanied by a group of English immigrants, lasting for two years.

'Two Utopias comprehended, within a half-mile square surrounded by a vast wilderness, past, present, and future, however abstrusely – the burning of Rome, city planning, explosion of stars, a new calendar, anarchy, a New Jerusalem, repression, expansion, moneyless Eden, exaltation of pearls, a three-hour working day, exaltation of horses, infinite regress, the united nations of earth, the many, the few, Lucifer, lotus-eaters, the falling of autumn leaves, the myths of Narcissus, good dentistry, many fictions. So that such perfectionist orders, which would have excluded much of mistaken life, seem mistaken life itself, with all its infinite variety.'





11. Striking Ritualistic Cover Art by Wendy Wood

Spence outlines his theories regarding 'a very ancient native mystical tradition' of the British Isles, with particular emphasis on the druids.




18. Japanese Psychic Photography

Clairvoyance & Thoughtography by T. Fukurai, 1931

A collection of case studies of 'thoughtography' also known as thermography or psychic photography, the supposed ability to impress mental images onto surfaces such as photographic film.

Tomokichi Fukurai (1869-1952) was a Japanese clinical psychologist who first introduced the term thoughtography after his 1910 study of psychic photography in Tokyo. This is the first English language edition of his major work.





Qutub is an evocatory poem, a stream of initiatic power dictated in 72 verses concerning the crooked path. Includes a commentary on the design of macrocosm and microcosm, and the Rite of The Opposer which reveals the gateway of the rite of the flesh. Drawing upon the Yatukih Sorcery of Ancient Persia, the Yezidic Cult of Shaitan, and the widdershin dance of the Sufi, to its present-day recension in the Sabbatic Tradition.




Gilbert has stated previously he wishes;


